# What is Bare Root?

**The prices given in the Small Fruits, Fruit Trees, Shade and Ornamental Trees, Shrubs, Roses and Windbreak sections are for bare root plants.** They are sold dormant, without soil on the roots, out of our cold storage building.

Bare root trees and shrubs can be planted as soon as the ground thaws in April through mid-June. It is better to get them in early. We have a selection of potted shrubs throughout the summer, but all trees including fruit trees are sold only in the spring. Earlier is better for bare root.

We carefully wrap the roots for you and include detailed planting instructions with every bare root purchase.

## Why Bare Root?

- Bare root trees rarely need staking.
- Bare root trees and shrubs get established with less stress to the plant.
- Bare root plants don't need to be watered every day. Water them thoroughly at planting and then wait a while before watering again.
- Bare root trees have been found to be less likely to blow over in a windstorm, even many years down the road.
- Bare root plants are much easier to take home. We've sent home thirty apple trees in a Buick Le Sabre.

## Bare Root Replacement Policy

Properly planted trees and shrubs are guaranteed to grow the first growing season. We do not guarantee over winter. We are happy to replace anything which did not thrive the first growing season.

## The Secret to Success with Bare Root Plants

The roots must always remain glistening wet at all times. They're ok in the package for a few days as long as there is no air leakage, but once you open the package you should be paranoid. Take just one plant out at a time and leave the rest wrapped up tight. It's ok to put them in a bucket of water during the day of planting, but don't leave anything in water overnight. Instead, if you don't finish, put them back in the bag and tie it up tightly.

# Small Fruit



## Viking Aronia

Dark purple berries are astringent for fresh eating, but nutritious and delicious in syrups, jams, and jellies. Shrub grows 5-6' tall.

## Red Lake Currant

Big clusters of zingy-sweet red berries on a 4' bush. Vibrant flavor. Beautiful color for jellies and sauce.

## Asparagus

Plant so the crown ends up 6" below the soil.

Millenium - thick stalks.

## Black Currants

Richly flavored black berries are high in anti-oxidants and other nutrients. Grows into a 5' bush.

## Nanking Cherry

Needs more than one plant for pollination. A vigorous 6' shrub with white flowers in spring and small, tasty red cherries.

2 yr: \$24; 1 yr. 18-24": \$5



## Golden Flowering Currant

A vigorous, leggy shrub with golden blossoms in spring that have a delicious clove fragrance. Black currants are shiny and tasty. Grows 5-6' tall.

2-3' 2yr: \$24; 2-3' twig: \$5



## Chokecherry

Native to this area, growing into 10-15' trees. Spreads by suckers. Black cherries for jelly, syrup, and wine. A few larger plants available.

3-4': \$7



## Adams Elderberry

For pies, jam, and elderberry wine. Great for wildlife. Very aggressive growth; allow 8' height and width. Glossy green foliage, white flowers, tiny purple berries.

## American Cranberry

An important source of food for birds. Can be used for jelly and syrup. An attractive 8-10' shrub with showy white blossoms in the spring.

## Gooseberry

Gooseberry grow 3-4'.

**Hinnomaki Red** - Bright red berries that are tangy and sweet.

**Pixwell** - hardy and reliable.

## Pink Champagne Currant

Clusters of small pink berries are tangy and delicious. Use for juice, jam, jelly, syrup, pies, or even in a salad.

## Beta Grape

The classic tart purple grape. Vigorous and hardy. Flavor is slightly different than King of the North but it's hard to say exactly how.

## King of the North Grape

Bears loads of tart purple grapes on a very vigorous, hardy, healthy plant. Would cover an arbor.

## Boyne Raspberry

The classic summer-bearing raspberry. Very hardy. Bears on second year canes; cut out the dead canes each season.

## Valiant Grape

Sweeter than other hardy purple grapes. Very hardy, but less vigorous. Can get mold on the fruit and various foliar diseases.

## Caroline Raspberry

Our current favorite raspberry. A fall-bearing, mow-down type. Huge, flavorful berries. Vigorous spreading plants.

## Honeyberry

Hardy and adapted to our soil. Yummy blue berries on 4-5' plants. Plant two different varieties.

Said to spread like a weed. Use the root to make the famous horseradish sauce that accompanies Prime Rib.

Ogallala - Old-fashioned everbearing. Hardy and flavorful.

Kind of a gourmet thing, but won't get you as many berries as the red ones. Sweet flavor on a fall-bearing type of raspberry.

# Fruit Tree Tips...

**We sell fruit trees only in the spring, bare root, between mid-April and mid-June.** Planting them earlier is better. You do not need to wait until the risk of frost has passed.

Our trees are grafted on to standard (non-dwarfing) rootstock, which is more reliably winter-hardy than dwarfing rootstocks.

## Pollination

**Apples** require a different variety of apple or flowering crab for pollination. The bees fly up to 1/2 mile for apple blossoms, so in practice you rarely need to be concerned. Two trees of the same variety do not pollinate each other.

**Cherry-Plums:** Sapalta and Compass pollinate each other.

**Plums:** Pembina and Pipestone require a Toka plum or wild plum for pollination.

**Cherries:** The cherries we sell do not require a pollinator.

**Apricots:** Somewhat self-fruitful, but having multiple varieties will increase fruit set. Apricot seedlings and Nanking Cherry will also work - see Windbreak section.

**Pears:** Early Gold and Ure pears can be pollinated by each other or by a Harbin pear seedling (see Windbreak section).

## How long before we harvest fruit?

Apple and plum trees will usually take from 3-6 years to bear. Some varieties, such as Centennial and Prairie Magic, will bear on younger trees. Sometimes apples can be stubborn and take eight or more years to bear. Cherries will take about four years. Pears can wait up to ten years.

## Protection

Protect the trunk in winter from rabbits, mice, and voles. Use white spiral plastic or metal window screen.

Deer love to eat apple trees any time of year. There is no avoiding the fact that you'll have to fashion some sort of barrier if you have deer. We don't have a magic solution, but recommend chicken netting or dog kennel fencing. The repellent spray Liquid Fence has worked well for us as a temporary solution.

# Fruit Trees



## Centennial Apple

Early. Very hardy. Bears as a young tree and very profusely. Small red apples are egg-sized and shaped.

## Haralson Apple

A long-time favorite. The best keeper apple. Harvest very late for best flavor. Relatively tart fruit is renowned for pies. Fruit can tolerate 24 degrees.

\$55



## Chestnut Apple

Late. Very hardy. Lovely blossoms. Small 2" apples are crisp and have a distinct, pear-like flavor that make them one of the best eating apples around.

## Honeycrisp Apple

Amazingly crisp, sweet. Protect the trunk from sunscald in the winter. We've had some reports of winter kill on these, but many have had good luck.

## Dolgo Crabapple

Rock solid hardy. Small red apples are a little too tart to eat fresh but make flavorful, bright red jelly, jam, and juice. Lovely white blossoms in spring.

## KinderKrisp Apple

Sweeter and a little smaller than Honeycrisp, but just as crunchy. A wonderful apple. Hardiness? Has been touched in the worst winters but has survived.

## Frostbite™ Apple

Medium-small, dark red apples are very sweet and crisp, with a unique, rich flavor. Pick very late for best flavor. One of our favorites.

## Prairie Magic Apple

Large, crisp and sweet apples borne on young trees. From Canada. A cross between Goodland and Macintosh.

\$55



## Goodland Apple

A hardy choice for this area. Ripens mid-season. Blush pink apples have crisp, pure white flesh and mild flavor. More attractive as a tree than other apples.

## Red Baron Apple

Mid-season. Large red apples are crisp, sweet, and mild. For eating, pie, or sauce. Bears young.

## Haralred Apple

A deeper red version of the popular Haralson that is also a little sweeter. Might be slightly less hardy. Excellent keeper. Late.

## Red Duchess Apple

One of the largest, prettiest apples for this area. Yellow skin with red striping. Early. Sweet. Bears young.

## SnowSweet Apple

Great taste and pure white flesh that stays white when cut. Ripens late. Has been hardy here for five years.

## Brookcot Apricot

A hardy Manchurian apricot seedling with tasty orange-yellow semi-freestone fruit that ripens in mid-August. Plant another variety or Nanking cherry for pollination.

## State Fair Apple

A cherry-pink apple shaped like a heart. Early to ripen. Sweet-tart taste. A good early-season apple for the north. Short storage life.

## Debbie's Gold Apricot

Firm-textured apricots are good for canning or fresh eating. Freestone. Yields improve with cross-pollination by other apricot varieties or Nanking Cherry.

## Sweet Sixteen Apple

Medium-sized red apples are crisp, sweet, and juicy. Unique cherry-candy flavor. Mid-season. Can be slow to start bearing; be patient.

## Westcot Apricot

Supposedly the best apricot for this area. Two-inch fruit is juicy and sweet. Yields improve with cross-pollination by other apricot varieties or Nanking Cherry.

## Triumph Apple

Listed as Zone 4 which means it may or may not work here. Cross of Honeycrisp and Liberty. Touted as resistant to apple scab disease. Red and crunchy.

## Bali Cherry

Also called Evans Cherry, this small tree bears loads of bright red cherries. Glossy green leaves. Cherries are mild and make great cherry pie. Grows 12-15'.

## Wodarz Apple

Bred in North Dakota. White apples ripen late. Firm texture, with a super-sweet flavor reminiscent of banana.

## Sweet Cherry Pie™ Cherry

A newer tart cherry that bears loads of big cherries. Bears heavily from a young age. Grows 12-15'. How does it compare to Bali? Please give feedback.

## Zestar! Apple

Huge, crisp apples expertly balance tartness and sweetness. Ripens in mid to late August. Keeps better than other early apples. Our best selling apple.

## Trader Mulberry

A hardy mulberry selected from a 100+ year old tree in Valley City, ND. Will grow to about 30 feet. Bears in 2 or 3 years.

# Fruit Trees



## Early Gold Pear

Plenty hardy. Small, yellow pears ripen 10 days earlier than Ure. Glossy green foliage. Use Ure or a Harbin Pear seedling as a pollinator.

## Toka Plum

A good choice to pollinate the larger plums. Very sweet in its own right, bearing small, light-colored sugar bombs. Great for eating or sauce. Ripens later than the other plums.

## Ure Pear

Developed in Manitoba, the Ure Pear has grown well for us but is stingy to bear. The fruit is quite tasty and about the size of a golf ball. Pollinates Early Gold.

## Compass Cherry Plum

Bears fruit which looks more like a cherry than a plum. Grows into a 15' tree; more upright than Sapalta. Pollinates Sapalta.

## Pembina Plum

Perhaps the best large plum for the Red River Valley. Very sweet blue plums with yellow flesh. Requires Toka or wild plum as a pollinator.

## Sapalta Cherry Plum

Dark maroon fruit with dark purple flesh. Likes to branch low to the ground like a shrub. Good for eating and excellent for sauce. Grows to about 6'.

## Pipestone Plum

The largest plum for this area. Bluish-red skin with yellow flesh. Very sweet and juicy. An old favorite. Requires Toka or wild plum as a pollinator.

## Quaking Aspen

A native tree well adapted to almost any soil type. Greenish-white bark, shiny round leaves, yellow fall color. 60'

## Ohio Buckeye

A charming smaller tree that makes an excellent ornamental for our area. Shiny brown nuts in the fall. Deer resistant. 20-30'.

## Summer Shimmer Aspen

A disease resistant hybrid aspen named for the shimmering leaves. Suckers far less than Quaking Aspen, making it more suitable for a yard tree. 60'

## Northern Catalpa

Zone 4. Best in warmer areas such as Fargo. Large leaves, attractive white blossoms, followed by large seed pods. 40-50'

5' Whip: \$60



## Swedish Columnar Aspen

A columnar aspen more resistant to disease than other poplars. Bright yellow fall color. Grows 40' tall and 10' wide.

## Amur Chokecherry

A fast growing smaller tree with white flowers and black fruit that the birds love. Distinctive exfoliating metallic bronze bark. Avoid planting too deep. 20-30'.

## Paper Birch

The classic white birch. Fast growing when young. Grows to 35'. For a clump, plant three in the same hole. See Windbreak section for smaller size.

## True North Coffeetree

Listed as Zone 4, but I think it will be hardy for most of our customers. Adaptable to many soil types. Upright vase shaped habit. Grows to 50'.

## Prairie Dream Birch

The longest surviving birch in NDSU trials. Resistant to the birch borer. Lovely white bark. Grows quickly to 35'.

3-4': \$45; 3': \$25



## New Horizon Elm

A smaller elm tree with excellent resistance to Dutch Elm Disease. Very few seeds. Grows 40-50' tall and 25' wide.

6': \$95



## Early Glow Buckeye

An Ohio Buckeye elected for great fall color and resistance to leaf scorch. Grows to 30'.

5-6': \$95



## Northern Empress Elm

An NDSU release. A smaller growing elm with excellent orange to red fall color. Grows to 28' tall. Resistant to Dutch Elm Disease.

## Prairie Expedition Elm

An NDSU release. A classic American elm selected for resistance to Dutch Elm Disease. Grows up to 3' a year. Grows to 60'. Larger sizes available.

## Ruby Tears Flowering Crab

A dwarf, naturally weeping habit with profuse pink blossoms in spring. Gets only 10' tall. Fruit hangs on until mid-winter. Listed as Zone 4.

## Princeton Elm

Proven tolerant to Dutch Elm Disease. Upright growth habit. Fast growing and tough. 60-70'. See Windbreak section for smaller size.

6' Whip: \$70



## Spring Snow Flowering Crab

One of the only flowering crabs that does not set fruit. Neat oval habit. Smothered with white blossoms each spring. Grows 15-20' tall and 15' wide.

## Coralburst Flowering Crab

A dwarf flowering crab growing only 8-10' tall and 10-12' wide. Pink flowers in spring.

3 1/2' top-grafted: \$90



## Hackberry

A very sturdy, adaptable shade tree. Moderate growth rate. Rough, corky bark. Grows 50-60'. Smaller size available in Windbreak section.

## Gladiator Flowering Crab

An upright, narrower tree with bronze-purple leaves and a profusion of bright pink blossoms in spring. Grows 20' tall and 9' wide. Great for small spaces.

## Snowbird Hawthorne

New to us. Listed as Zone 3 and should be fine in our soil. White flowers in the spring. Has thorns. Grows 20' tall and wide.

## Red Splendor Fl. Crab

A Bergeson original. Profuse pink blossoms. Bright red berries hang on into the winter. Very hardy. This is the one planted all over around here. 25'.

## Northern Acclaim Honeylocust

A thornless & seedless selection from NDSU with good winter hardiness. Airy and delicate texture provides light shade. Golden fall color. Grows 40-50'.

## Royal Gem Flowering Crab

A hardy dwarf flowering crab. Reddish emerging foliage. Rose-red blossoms. Top-grafted. Grows only 5 to 8' tall.

## Quick Fire Hydrangea

Plant tree-form hydrangea at your own risk in this climate. Best in a protected area in town. But very pretty. Grows to 7'.

## Vanilla Strawberry Hydrangea

Plant tree-form hydrangea at your own risk in this climate. Best in a protected area in town. Gorgeous if they work. Grows to 7'.

## Fall Fiesta Maple

A selection of Hard Sugar Maple that is faster growing and tough, with great fall color. In the Red River Valley, plant on higher ground. 50-75'.

## Dwarf Korean Lilac Tree

Grafted on a 3' standard to make a lollipop-on-a-stick look. Grows to about seven feet. Trim right after blooming for best show next year.

## Inferno™ Maple

Less picky about soil than other Sugar Maple. Turns fiery orange-red in the fall. Upright habit. Grows 30-40'.

6' whip: \$75



## Snowdance™ Tree Lilac

First Editions®. A Japanese Tree Lilac that blooms profusely, consistently, and early in its life. Does not produce seeds. Dark green leaves. Grows 15-18'.

## Flame Amur Maple

More tolerant of our soil than most maples. Potential red fall color. Grows 15-20'.

## American Linden

Basswood. Excellent shade tree due to its large leaves. Medium growth rate. Native. Fragrant blossoms make great honey. 60'. A few larger trees available.

## Hot Wings Tatarian Maple

A 20-25' maple that is more tolerant of dryness and alkalinity. Fun, bright red helicopters in summer and possibly good fall color.

## Greenspire Linden

Rated as Zone 4, but ours has been doing fine for about 15 years. A very attractive, neatly symmetrical tree. Grows 40' tall and 30' wide.

## Silver Maple

Very fast growing tree. Grows big and tall. Not for the heaviest Red River Valley soils. See Windbreak section for smaller sizes.

## Harvest Gold Linden

A hardy hybrid linden developed in Manitoba. Lovely peeling bark and consistent gold fall color. Grows 30-40' tall and 25' wide. Limited supply.

## Hard Sugar Maple

A slow growing but high quality tree. Yellow or orange fall color. Grows to 50 or 60 feet. Windbreak size only. For larger sizes choose Fall Fiesta or Inferno sugar maples.

We are replacing Autumn Blaze with this variety. It grows quickly, while turning bright red earlier in the fall. Seedless. 40-50'.

## Amber Jubilee Ninebark

A shrub that has been trained to a single stem to form a small tree. Lovely golden emerging foliage changes to medium green. Grows 6-8'.

## Marmo Maple

Probably one of the hardest and least picky of the fast-growing maple hybrids. Fall color can be anywhere from yellow to red. Grows 50-60'.

## Bur Oak

The classic lovely native tree for this area. Attractive habit and acorns for wildlife. Grows 50+ feet tall.

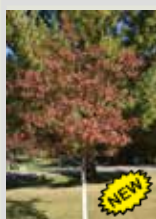

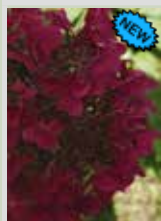

# Secrets to Growing Roses

- **Buy them bare root.**

Only when buying bare root can you inspect the entire plant, including the roots. Pick a plant with sturdy stems, firm and healthy shoots, and plenty of roots. The best time to plant is in April or May.

- **Choose hardy varieties.**

We carry some roses that will need protection in the winter. However, there are plenty of roses that are both lovely and hardy. It is always best to ask us to help you choose a rose matched to your degree of gardening skill and propensity to risk.

- **Choose a sunny spot.**

Choose a spot that gets at least seven hours of sunlight per day.

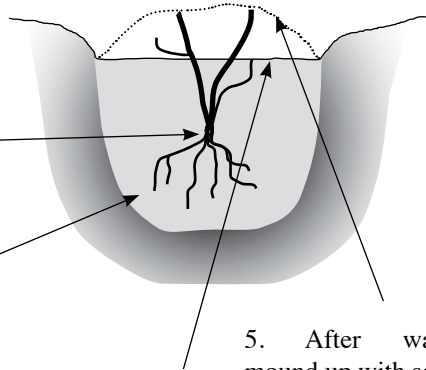
- **Plant them very deep, like this:**

1. Dig a nice, deep hole.

2. Make sure the crown is 5-6" below the ground.

3. Fill the hole with a mixture of soil and peat. Optionally, mix in some bonemeal.

4. Leave room at the top of the hole to hold water. Water thoroughly, using water soluble fertilizer mixed according to directions.



5. After watering, mound up with soft peat to protect the shoots from the sun. You may leave a shoot or two barely exposed.
